Therefore, the material in this article may be useful for SUMP clause 6.1.


### 3. Problem approached and content overview

An explanation and detailed description of the advantages and challenges of the various stages of limiting vehicle movement in space is provided (below).








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
The methodology of introducing the car - free idea and an example of project management structures were also described. Examples of tasks of individual stakeholders were also indicated.
